His six-book Latin hexameter poem *De rerum natura* (DRN for short), variously translated *On the nature of things* and *On the nature of the universe*, survives virtually intact, although it is disputed whether he lived to put the finishing touches to it. As well as being a pioneering figure in the history of philosophical poetry, Lucretius has come to be our primary source of information on Epicurean physics, the official topic of his poem.
